For many years, the Art Department at Ridge High School has exhibited student artwork on homosote panels which have become quite dilapidated. Over the past few years, volunteers have covered the panels with paper. Last year, the surfaces were repainted but, with the hinges tearing, the panels are now worn out. The Art Department needs to replace these panels with portable, light-weight units. These new panels would greatly enhance the exhibit experience by visitors and assist Ridge's aspiring art students in a professional presentation of their work.

To have these panels in time for the 2012 Art Show, we are asking families with children enrolled in an art class at Ridge, families of recent art major graduates, families interested in the future of the program and alumni of the Art Department to consider making a tax-deductible donation to the Bernards Township Education Foundation (BTEF) to support the purchase of new panels.

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## BOE Update: "Keep Up the Hard Work... Except Over Recess....."

Mr. Sean Siet provided two presentations at the Jan. 9 meeting. The first presentation provided a review of the various college level test results and trends in college admissions. The great news is that Ridge students are maintaining results that keep Ridge a top NJ-ranked school. For all of the students who were waiting to hear from Early Action colleges, deferrals are trending up due to a 20% increase in applications.

The second presentation provided results of the Homework Survey. The survey had 1931 parent, 236 staff and 2756 student participants. Some of the issues raised were: more lead time for projects; group project grading issues; and the level of homework at honors/AP levels. Mr. Siet reported that action is being taken! The district is developing a homework policy, staff will be trained, curriculum will be revised during the 2012 summer, and a better method of coordinating tests is being determined. I believe we all enjoyed learning of the new action that "no homework will take place over recess periods."

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## *The Season of Testing, from p. 1*

### State testing for Juniors March 6th, 7th, and 8th

It is that time of year when the high school begins to plan for the many upcoming assessments of our students. Mid-term examinations began on January 25th for all students, followed by the High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA) for all juniors. If your child is a junior you will be receiving an informational guide and student preparation booklet for the HSPA through Language Arts classes. In anticipation of the HSPA, I would like to highlight a few important aspects of the test to help you prepare your son or daughter.

It is important that all juniors are in attendance for the HSPA. The testing dates are March 6th, 7th, and 8th. Per New Jersey State law, all students must pass the HSPA in order to graduate from high school. If your son or daughter is not in attendance for testing as a junior, they will have to test senior year. Failure to take the test may result in scheduling changes for senior year in order to help prepare students for the test that they missed.

The HSPA assesses the knowledge and skills that students have gained pertaining to the Core Content Standards set by the Department of Education of New Jersey. Specifically, The HSPA measures proficiency in Mathematics and Language Arts Literacy.

On March 6th, students will take the Mathematics component of the test. This assessment contains two types of questions. Most of the mathematics questions are multiple-choice. Other questions are open-ended and are scored by trained raters from the state.

The mathematics section tests student's knowledge of the following skills:

- Number and Numerical Operation
- Geometry and Measurement
- Patterns and Algebra
- Data Analysis, Probability, Statistics, and Discrete Mathematics.

On March 7th and 8th, students will be taking the Language Arts Literacy section of the HSPA. Most of the test questions will be multiple-choice; however, some questions will require students to provide written responses.

In order to help your child prepare for the HSPA, I recommend that you review the test preparation booklet with your son or daughter. Additionally, students always perform best when they are well rested and well fed. On the nights of the HSPA encourage your child to get a good sleep. Also, be certain that your son or daughter arrives to school having eaten a good breakfast, as the testing lasts the entire morning.

Again, your son or daughter will be bringing home information regarding the test from their Language Arts classes that should clarify any lingering concerns that you may have.
